We need a UN General Assembly on AGI to discuss and agree to:

1. **Global AGI Observatory**—is needed to track progress in AGI-relevant research and development, and provide early warnings on AI security to Member States.
2. **International System of Best Practices and Certification of Secure and Trustworthy AGI**—is needed to identify best practices and provide certification for AGI security, development, and usage. Verification of AGI alignment with human values, controlled and non-deceptive behavior, and secure development is essential for international trust.
3. **UN Framework Convention on AGI**—is needed to establish shared objectives and flexible protocols to manage AGI risks and ensure equitable global benefit distribution.
4. **Feasibility Study on a UN AGI Agency**—understanding that managing AGI is far more complex than managing nuclear systems as with IAEA.

UN GA Adopted Two Resolutions on AI



US Initiated resolution:
“Seizing the opportunities of safe, secure, and trustworthy artificial intelligence systems for sustainable development” (A/78/L.49)

China initiated resolution
“Enhancing international cooperation on capacity-building of artificial intelligence” (A/78/L.86)
